Ambreen's Tale of Bravery and Resilience Against Yaseen

In the city of Hyderabad, a tale of bravery and resilience unfolded as Ambreen, a 20 to 23-year-old unmarried and disabled young woman, found her voice in the pursuit of justice. Ambreen's world shattered when she disclosed to her brother and sister-in-law that she was pregnant, a result of a heinous crime committed by Yaseen, a cable operator, three to four months prior.

On August 2, 2019, Ambreen's brother, Islam, took a stand for justice by filing an FIR against the accused. The investigation, led by ASI Muhammad Ali Abbasi and later Inspector Naiz Ahmed Panhwar, delved into the painful details. Medical examinations, DNA testing, and statements from witnesses painted a grim picture of the crime.

Yet, Ambreen, with unwavering determination, stood tall and faced the legal battle ahead. On February 4, 2022, after 2 years and 7 months of tireless efforts, the 2nd ADJ GBV Court Hyderabad, under the wise judgment of Mr. Muhammad Abbas Siyal, announced a verdict that echoed justice. The unmarried, disabled girl had given birth to a baby boy from the rape, and the DNA matched, leaving no room for doubt.

The trial, though arduous, was a triumph for Ambreen. Supported by Legal Aid Society advocate Shahnaz Buriro, Ambreen faced cross-examinations, produced evidence, and stood strong.

The accused, Yaseen, failed to prove his innocence and was found guilty. The judgment declared Yaseen guilty, sentencing him to 25 years of rigorous imprisonment and imposing a fine of Rs. 2,00,000. In the event of

non-payment, an additional six months of imprisonment awaited him. The co-accused was acquitted, but Ambreen's victory was etched in the legal history of the court.
